There is an answer to Sudan.

Immediate action is needed to end the cycle of death and destruction once and for all in Sudan. Darfur is just the latest manifestation of Sudan's crisis, coming on the heels of an even deadlier war in southern Sudan.

Activists can make a difference now by urging elected officials and policy makers to implement the following "3Ps" crisis response strategy:

Promote the Peace: Sudan needs persistent, high-level diplomacy aimed at creating sustainable peace and laying the groundwork for a more secure future.

Protect the People: Even as we pursue peace, we must protect the innocent civilians persecuted by violence and instability.

Punish the Perpetrators: The perpetrators of the genocide must be held accountable. To break the cycle of impunity, we must impose genuine consequences on those who commit these crimes and on those who allow them to happen.

FIVE THINGS YOU CAN DO IN 15 MINUTES!

Lead your leaders by Contacting the White House (1-202-456-1414 or e-mail comments@whitehouse.gov) and the U.S. Congress (1-202-224-3121 9:00am–6:00pm EST, Monday through Friday) and demanding:

- **Peace:** that the U.S. lead by forming a "quartet"—with France, the UK, and China—to coordinate pressure on the Government of Sudan and the rebel groups to reach an inclusive peace agreement. These key countries should send senior diplomats to the region to support the AU/UN mediation team;

- **Protection:** that the U.S. support full deployment of the UN/AU Hybrid peacekeeping force by working through NATO to provide the force with the military hardware—aircraft, armored helicopters, surveillance equipment, etc.—to ensure that the force has the capacity to respond quickly and effectively to attacks against civilians; and funding the U.S. share of the mission, an estimated \$725 million.
- **Punishment:** that the U.S. provide information to the International Criminal Court on crimes against humanity in Darfur and support additional multilateral targeted sanctions on those persons most responsible for the killing in Darfur.

Ask the Candidates what they will do as President to stop the violence in Darfur, ensure the success of the Comprehensive Peace Agreement in southern Sudan, and prevent future genocide and crimes against humanity. Visit www.askthecandidates.org to learn more.
